Originally in integrated team with Southend Council commissioning council led initiatives such as the strategic and operational elements of Southend's sex working workstream. Lead, managed and delivered significant change projects involving stakeholders such as the South East Essex Trauma Alliance. Managed a portfolio focusing on 'complex needs' spanning high intensity users, rough sleeping, personality disorder, dual diagnosis etc. Formed and Chaired both national meeting for clinicians working with rough sleepers and the South East Essex Mental Health Partnership Forum.

Full member of the UKCP. Delivered one-to-one Psychotherapy, predominantly in the field of trauma. Worked with all age ranges with various needs such as substance misuse, eating disorders, psychosis, those in sex work; 'Personality Disorder and Complex Needs'.

Line Managed four middle managers who were responsible for 12 staff and 25 volunteers across various services such as BAME outreach, peer support, supported accommodation, information and advice and counselling for adults and CYP in schools. Developed successful bids and tenders for services, performance monitoring, managing budgets. Gave one-to-one psychotherapy with clients.

NHS/CCG funded position to support people rough sleeping with their health and mental health. Headed outreach group to women selling sex. Acted as advocate for the needs of our service users. Initiated and lead first Sex Worker outreach for Southend
